Application for Financial Support

Due by February 1 annually

Financial support is offered in the form of teaching assistantships and fellowships. A teaching assistant may be assigned a class (one per semester) over which the assistant has full classroom responsibility; such classes generally include Latin 1100, 1200, and 2000, CH 1050 ("Greek and Latin in English Usage"), and CH 1060 ("Classical Mythology"). Or a teaching assignment may entail assisting in one of the department's large lecture courses, such as CH 1060, 2100 ("Greek Culture"), and 2200 ("Roman Culture"), or in a writing intensive course. Assistantships are awarded after consideration of the applicant's background, proficiency in Latin, transcripts, and letters of recommendation.

An applicant may be eligible for a fellowship in addition to a teaching assistantship. The department has a Walter Miller Fellowship, which is offered as a bonus in addition to one teaching assistantship on a competitive basis. Fellowships are also offered by the Graduate School, such as the Gregory Fellowship, the Huggins Scholarship, and the Ridgel Fellowship for Minority Americans; worthy candidates for these fellowships are nominated by the department.

A completed financial support application form, transcripts, GRE scores, 3 letters of recommendation, a statement of interest, and a writing sample should be sent to the Director of Graduate Studies, Department of Classical Studies, 405 Strickland Hall, University of Missouri, Columbia, MO. 65211-4150. Applicants interested in being considered for teaching assistantships and fellowships must submit their applications and supporting materials by February 1.
